Improvements Underway in Southwest Downtown Colorado Springs

Please join us this month for a presentation titled “Planning to Implementation - A discussion of improvements underway in Southwest Downtown Colorado Springs”. Ryan Tefertiller, Urban Planning Manager, and Ryan Phipps, Senior Engineer, will describe the City’s efforts to prepare Southwest Downtown for significant private investment in the coming years. Specific topics include streetscape and stormwater improvements, the new pedestrian bridge to America the Beautiful Park, parking management, and mobility options.”

Ryan Tefertiller has been the lead planner for Downtown Colorado Springs since 2008, Ryan holds a B.A. in Environmental Studies from the University of Colorado, and a M.S. in Environment Policy from the University of Michigan. Ryan works with various City Agencies and stakeholders on a wide range of issues including mobility, public space design, homelessness, place-making, parking, public art and others. Ryan wrote and gained adoption of the Downtown Form-Based Code (2009), the Imagine Downtown Master Plan (2009) as well as the Experience Downtown Master Plan (2016) referenced above.

Ryan Phipps holds a BSCE and MSCE from the University of Washington. He has been a Project Manager for the City of Colorado Springs Public Works since 2013. Ryan has been involved in most aspects of Public Works type projects from the planning phase, design and through construction. He is currently managing the Pikes Peak Ave Reconstruction Project, the Southwest Downtown Infrastructure projects, and the Circle Drive Bridges Replacement as well as a number of smaller road, bridge and non-motorized transportation projects.

Thank you all for your continued membership. We look forward to seeing you at the next meeting.

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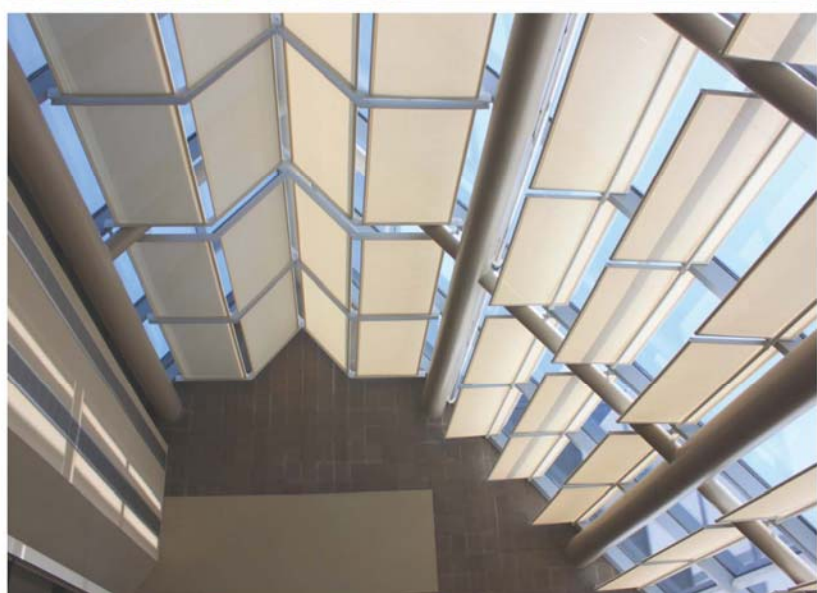
